December 2019

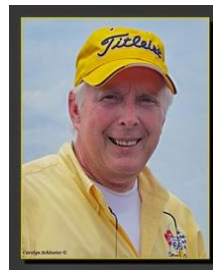

Minutes:

Meeting called to order by President, Bob Isermann at 6:00pm

Greeting by Pete, Manager of Old Hickory

- Thanked us for having meetings at Old Hickory
- Values our patronage
- Mentioned a type of membership to Old Hickory for club members (more details to come)

President Remarks (Bob Isermann):

- Bob welcomed the new officers and board members.
- Bob will assume the role of past-president.
- Lynda Rothweil will assume new duties as rules and regulations chairperson as well as board member.
- Bob thanked the other officers over the last two years for their continuous support.
- He opined that the 39% increase in membership shows that the team behind him was very successful in putting Route 66 in front of the community.
- Bob then turned the meeting over to Bill Mitchell to continue.

2020 President Remarks (Bill Mitchell):

- Bill indicated his continued appreciation for the friendliness of the members and fellow officers.
- Autocross remains an extremely important event that should be continued unless and until the cost becomes prohibitive.
- He would like to see Poage be even more involved in their sponsorship of the club.
- Social activities remain important (events, road runs, dine outs, car shows, etc).
 - A social director is needed to take ownership of the social life of the club.
 - Nancy Streib is assuming the role of social committee chair.
 - We need to encourage other members to get involved in the club.
- Our retention rate remains excellent.
- Charity Committee will continue to be managed by Howard.



BOD Meeting Continued

President Continued (Bill Michell):

- We need to discuss our point system for ongoing participants.
- Bill opined ideas about the new banner for the corvette museum.
 - Bill invited any & all board members & officers to submit ideas for upcoming club activities/proposals.
- Membership will be handled as in the past.
- Detta Nelson is going to be in charge of the desserts for the Christmas party.
- There are 69 paid attendees for the Christmas party. There will be 7 tables rounds of 10 people. Room for only 1 additional person.
- Reminder of NCCC 12/21 Christmas party at Fast Lane

Treasurer Report (Rich Weinhold):

- As of 10/31/19, the club's bank balance
 - Christmas deposit
 - Dues
 - Expenses
 - No outstanding checks
- Christmas Party
 - 2018: 50 people
 - 2019: Outstanding balance due – not counting the bar tab
 - 2019 party desserts
 - Howard will be gracing us with his Saxophone expertise
- Square has been used 90 times in 2019

Autocross (Tom Reitz):

- Arena cost increased from last year
 - 40 drivers is the break-even point
 - 2019 had 59 drivers
 - 2018 had 38 drivers (bad weather)
- 2020 dates are June 27 & 28
 - A small lot is the size of GM plant lot

Autocross Continued (Tom Reitz):

- Other options & location(s) discussed
 - Sponsors are allowed but rare
 - Size parking lot needed Club Expense & Profit Discussion:
 - 2019 was about \$xxxx net
 - food profit. This is a reason many people come to our event
 - Shirts cost
 - 2019 participant fees for all 14 events
 - Idea of reducing fees for husband/wife teams
- Other discussion:
 - Go to a restaurant on Saturday night after the event
 - Do we want to continue with autocross?
 - It was a consensus that the 2020 event will take place
 - A discussion of ideas for additional fund raising
 - We had 49 volunteers/workers in 2019
 - Fun Run – additional ½ hour

Points:

- Point participation is low on the club side
- Perfect attendance = car show & one day of the autocross
- NCCC points are recorded online
- We would have to make a recommendation to the membership to do away with the points and if it is the consensus, remove it from the standing rules.

Motion to Discontinue Club Points System:

Result: PASSED

Miscellaneous Discussion Points:

- Club meeting falls on January 2 – do we want to have it on that day or move it to the next week? Consensus is that January 2 be continued.
- Lynda indicated that all meetings should have a set agenda order to be followed for ease in preparing minutes and road notes.
- Club apparel award – names picked – club logo on a piece of clothing & be present. \$10 rolls over each meeting/before 50/50 – it would be tracked in the minutes. Whose name was drawn and wasn't present or didn't have apparel. Idea was gas card. Cash was preferred.
- Lynda mentioned we should have a sign at the Christmas party showing “perfect attendance” for pictures.

Adjournment:

Bob Isermann officially handed the gavel & Roberts Rules of Order to Bill Mitchell. Meeting adjourned at 7:14pm
