Biography of Mike Dixon, the Speaker for Our February 2025 Membership Meeting:

Mike Dixon will tell us about some of his experiences that happened during the reign of the Chevrolet Corvette. For almost 30 years the city of St. Louis, Missouri had the privilege of being its birthplace, except for the 300 made in Flint, Michigan, while the plant in St. Louis was being readied.

Mike started working at the St. Louis Corvette Assembly Plant on October 3rd, 1969. He didn't know it at the time, or even at the end of his tenure there, which lasted 18 years, that the period of his existence there would have the impact on his life that it has. And he had never read any stories told from the men who worked on the lines there in very adverse conditions that you will soon hear about.

Mike's first night at the plant watching his soon to be good friend shift through all four gears on a set of rollers at a speed of 80 miles an hour had quite the impact on him. He has said "That scent of exhaust, gasoline and smoking tires was better than any expensive French perfume I've ever had the privilege to encounter."

Mike is currently the caretaker of five. He says of the Corvette: "It's in my blood, some people would call it a disease, and if that's the case I'm as terminal as anyone can get and I'm not looking to get well anytime soon."

Mike says: "I feel the need to tell my story about the days 6500 days and or nights that I spent being a part of building the world's greatest sports car."

From [Just Cool Old Cars](#) :

From 1953-1979 all Corvette's were built in St. Louis, Mo. And, on October 26, in 1981, the last STL 'Vette rolled off the line.

In 1953, General Motors hand-assembled the first 300 Corvettes on a small prototype assembly line within the Flint Chevrolet plant.

This temporary setup allowed GM designers and engineers to innovate and perfect new manufacturing techniques.

On December 28, 1953, Corvette production transitioned to St. Louis, Missouri.

The massive General Motors Union Boulevard Complex became the new home for the Corvette, ramping up production slowly.

By 1954, 3,640 units were produced, with sales initially sluggish. However, production grew steadily, reaching 30,000 units per year by 1969 and peaking at 53,000 units in 1979.

The St. Louis plant faced challenges. Workers endured tough conditions, with no air-conditioning and a glass roof that turned the factory into a furnace. Despite the hardships, their dedication ensured the Corvette's success.

On August 1, 1980, Chevrolet moved Corvette production to a new state-of-the-art facility in Bowling Green, Kentucky. This transition marked a new chapter for the Corvette, with improved production techniques and better working conditions.

Bowling Green continues to be the home of the Corvette, and the loss of the Corvette is still remembered every year in St. Louis.



Member's Stories:

Corvette Owners School by Craig Besand

For new Corvette buyers, you can attend the Ron Fellows Corvette Owners School. This normally costs \$3695 but you can attend for \$1,000 if you are the first owner of a new Corvette. Chevrolet covers the remaining cost which includes the school, lodging and breakfast, lunch each day. The resort is in Pahrump, NV. The idea came when a group of race enthusiasts were renting the local Las Vegas Speedway track in the 1990s. The school became too popular, so the school wanted to build their own track. Clark County, where Las Vegas is located, would not approve it. This is so it would not compete with the speedway. So, they built the track in Pahrump just over the county line. This facility is a country club for motorsports similar to country clubs for golf like Old Hickory. In 2004 the facility along with Chevrolet and Ron Fellows created the Corvette Owners school with several classes with differing skills levels. This is my second time there as I went after I bought my C7. The school is awesome, and I would recommend it to any C8 Corvette owner. I learned so much this week about the C8 that I did not know and even the Museum delivery did not tell me. The school has become very popular over the years and now has 10,000 students per year. We covered the following:

Member's Stories:

Tux's Backroad Boogie 2024 By Larry Rieders

Ellen and I left STL for this cruise and 4 hours later arrived in Greenburg, IN around 1:30 PM. We met about a dozen other "cruisers" at a local restaurant for a snack then proceeded to the prearranged Hampton Inn for check in.

There was a mini cruise for about an hour & a half covering lots of farmland and passing several creeks, combines & fields... We returned to hotel and called it a night.

Breakfast was at the hotel, followed by an all drivers meeting to address who the lead drivers were, formations, how to handle breakdowns & potential traffic issues...

Afterwards all 60 corvettes in numerous rows started up and the rumbling of their sweet tunes began shortly after 9 AM. Roads were blocked, and the "follow the leader" began.

After about 45 minutes ALL OF US were corralled into the dairy farm for our tour of this huge family run business. 8,000 head of cattle, yielding 50 lbs of milk each day, and birthing calves 8 to 12 a day! Each cow yields milk for between 7 & 10 years... The combine on display is powered by a 640 hp 12-cylinder Jaguar & can cruise at up to 45 mph!

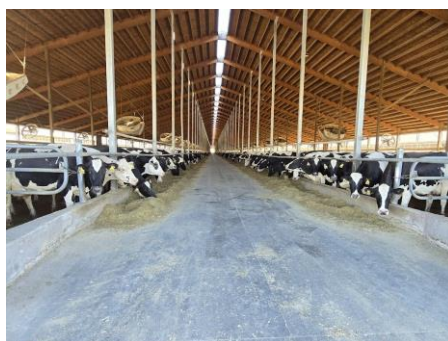
Saturday night was ended with everyone socializing in & around the hotel.... Overall, a well planned & executed cruise from start to finish!!!
